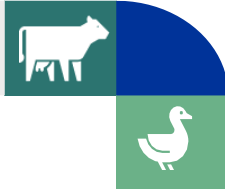

Anna-Maria Moisander-Jylhä

Provincial Veterinarian at the Regional State Administrative Agency for Western and Inland Finland



Anna-Maria Moisander-Jylhä graduated as a Licentiate of Veterinary Medicine from the University of Helsinki in 2007. She began her career as a municipal veterinarian in 2005. From 2010 to 2018, Anna-Maria worked in the field of production animal health care. In 2016, she completed the national specialist veterinarian degree and qualified as a Specialist in Production Animal Medicine.

Since 2018, Anna-Maria has worked as a Provincial Veterinarian at the Regional State Administrative Agency for Western and Inland Finland. Her work has focused particularly on supervising the use, storage, and documentation of veterinary medicines, both by veterinarians and farmers. She also participates in investigations when drug residues are detected in food products.

Her responsibilities further include monitoring and guidance related to animal welfare, monitoring and control of agricultural subsidies, and development tasks concerning current work.

Kaisa Suokumpu

Provincial Veterinary Officer for the Regional Administrative Agency for Eastern Finland



Kaisa Suokumpu (DVM 2017, University of Helsinki) has worked as a veterinarian since 2015 and as a Provincial Veterinary Officer for the Regional Administrative Agency for Eastern Finland since 2017. Suokumpu supervises the use of veterinary medicines and records of used veterinary medicinal products done by both veterinarians and farmers. She also works with pharmacologically active residue findings in products of animal origin, complaints about veterinarians, animal transports between Member States and animal identification and registration. Suokumpu is currently studying postgraduate professional studies in specialist veterinary training (general veterinary medicine, emphasis on veterinary inspection) in University of Helsinki.



Sebastian Moya

Sebastian has focused on studying the psychosocial determinants influencing the implementation of biosecurity measures and the use of antibiotics in dairy cattle and poultry farms by private veterinarians, government veterinarians, farmers and farm workers in Spain and France. His interests are based on participatory methods and cross-cutting communication channels with all stakeholders on livestock farms.
